Syracuse University Academic Year 2009-2010 Graduate Student Application Deadline: February 1st, 2009

Scholarship For Service (SFS) is a unique program that is designed to increase and strengthen the cadre of government information security professionals at the federal, state, and local levels. This program is available only to individuals who are accepted to or are currently enrolled in certain masters or doctoral degree programs at Syracuse University. The SFS scholarship provides one-year or two-year scholarships that fund tuition costs and a yearly stipend of \$12,000 in return for working for a government agency after graduation. One year of government service is required for each year of SFS scholarship funding. The scholarships are supported through grants to universities that are awarded by the National Science Foundation. To qualify for a SFS scholarship an applicant must be a U.S. citizen with a competitive academic record. It is common for SFS graduates seeking information security positions with a government agency to be required to undergo a background investigation to obtain a security clearance. Criminal convictions may prevent approval for a security clearance.

The following is the process to apply for the SFS scholarship:

1. Review the SFS program information on the website at <http://www.sfs.opm.gov> to confirm interest and eligibility (e.g., U.S. citizen, accepted/enrolled graduate student, background).
2. Complete the cover sheet (page 1) and return it and the following documentation to Bridget Crary in Hinds Hall Room 114 at least 7-days prior to the planned interview dates (see below).
 - Undergraduate and graduate transcripts.
 - A one-page essay explaining (1) your educational and career objectives; (2) how you will support the larger national goals for which the SFS program was created.
 - Any letters of recommendation that should be considered.
 - Any additional information that should be considered.
3. Interview selection decision by SFS Program faculty. Notification is made by Kathy Allen.
4. Scholarship selection decision by SFS Program faculty based on application materials and interview. Notification is made by Dr. Bernard in the February – April timeframe.

Interviews:

Applicant interviews are conducted on campus in February 2009 through March 2009 and are scheduled by the SFS Administrative Coordinator; Kathy Allen. Early applications are encouraged and those students selected for interview will be notified of the date, time, and place via phone and or email by Ms. Allen. Please note that this application is for SFS scholarship funding during Academic Year 2009-2010 (begins August 2009).
