

Residence Halls and Campus Apartments

Students registered for summer sessions may reside on the North Campus in Shaw Hall. Also available for students is SU apartment housing on South Campus, where a minimum occupancy period of six weeks is required. Complete the Housing and Meal Plan Application on page Pkt. 15 to indicate your choice.

Check-in for Shaw Hall takes place daily from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the main desk. MAYmester check-in begins May 10 at 5 p.m. Front desk hours are 8 a.m. to 12 a.m.

South Campus check-in occurs at the Goldstein Student Center, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. only, unless other arrangements are made by contacting the South Campus Housing Office, 315-443-2567. **The South Campus Housing Office is not open on the weekends.** Students arriving on campus outside of business hours (8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday) will not be allowed to check in until the next business day.

Watson Hall

405 University Place... Built in 1954

Watson Hall houses 448 men and women on four floors. Rooms within the building are of single gender and are coed by alternating rooms. Room types within this building include singles, open doubles, and two, three, four, and six person suites. The building also contains a main lounge, study space, and laundry facilities. Food Works campus grocery, and the Watson Theatre are located in this building.

Dining and Dining Facilities

• **Shaw Dining Center**, located in the residence hall, is open seven days a week for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. The facility has salad, pasta, and beverage bars; a delicatessen; the "Sizzlery" for grilled food; and an entrée section for casseroles and other hot foods. The 19, 15, and 10+ meal plans must be used in these facilities. Food also can be purchased with SUpocard Food* or cash.

• **Schine Dining Center**, located in the Schine Student Center, is open Monday through Friday 8 a.m.-3 p.m. The dining center is closed on University holidays. Food can be purchased with SUpocard Food* or cash.

For Undergraduates Living in the Residence Hall:

Undergraduates living in North Campus housing are required to choose one of the following meal plans:

- 19 meals per week: \$174 per week OR
- 15 meals per week (Monday-Friday): \$162 per week OR
- 10 meals + \$30 SUpocard Food* per week: \$162 per week

For All Other Students:

Meal plans are optional for students not residing in North Campus housing. Interested students may choose one of the following:

- One of the three meal plans listed above OR
- SUpocard Food: available in \$25 increments; payment must be made at the Archbold Bursar Office prior to funds being applied to food account.

*SUpocard Food allows you to purchase food on an à la carte basis at any of the University dining facilities listed above. Note: All SUpocard Food accounts end August 15.

Housing Agreement for Summer Students

1. All Syracuse University Rules and Regulations as stated in the publication of the same name are in effect during the summer months. Copies of Academic Rules and Regulations are available at the Registrar's Office web site, coursecatalog.syr.edu/rules.aspx.

2. The University reserves the right to determine who shall be eligible for student housing. The following are the minimum requirements:

Students must be registered for summer session classes or participating in a University-related activity,

and

students must have been registered, and completed in good standing, the immediately preceding spring semester, or be registered for enrollment for the immediately succeeding fall semester.

Students participating in University-related activities must have the relevant department chair or director certify, on University letterhead and with their signature, the legitimacy of the activity, duration, and acknowledge their responsibility for addressing behavior concerns in accordance with University policies and procedures. This documentation is to be attached to the Summer Housing and Meal Plan application and is subject to the approval of the director of Housing, Meal Plan and ID Card Services.

3. Student shall comply and cause all guests to comply with all applicable codes, ordinances, and laws affecting the University's student housing and the student's particular housing unit. This includes any and all directives disseminated and established by staff of The Office of Residence Life. Students are expected to attend all floor meetings; students are responsible for knowing and abiding by all information distributed and discussed at these meetings.

4. Students are expected to respect the rights of other residents within the housing facility. Housing facilities will be reasonably quiet at all times; specific quiet hours will be in effect as established by the University.

5. Students are prohibited from activating, without reasonable cause, fire alarm systems, or damaging, discharging, or tampering with fire safety equipment. Abuse of these safety features is a violation of the Student Code of Conduct and will result in a referral to the University's Office of Judicial Affairs.

6. The following items are NOT permitted in University housing facilities:

Pets or animals of any kind with the exception of fish in a tank not to exceed 10 gallons and approved service animals registered with the Office of Disability Services

Air Conditioners

Candles

Incense

Ovens

Hot Plates, high-resistance heating devices, or grills of any type

Microwaves over 1000 Watts

Refrigerators over 5 cubic feet

Halogen and multi-headed lamps

7. The University will permit registered guests to stay overnight in student housing for a period not exceeding three consecutive days, subject to consent by all authorized roommates. Students are directed to the Office of Residence Life (ori.syr.edu) for policy information and to register an overnight guest. If the University terminates its permission for any reason, guests must vacate immediately.

8. Students shall be held financially responsible for damage to residence hall rooms, public areas, and/or apartments.

9. University housing is available on a weekly basis only to students attending a summer session course or University conference. A week of occupancy begins on Sunday and ends at 1 p.m. on the following Saturday. Students must depart before 1 p.m. to avoid incurring additional expense.

10. During the first and second summer sessions, undergraduate students residing on North Campus must have a meal plan. In addition to the meal plan, SUpocard Food accounts can be used to purchase food weekdays on an à la carte basis at the Schine Student Center or other Food Services locations in operation during the summer.

11. I.D. Cards will be automatically activated for students requesting and paying for a meal plan. Entrance to a dining center is permitted once per meal period. New students must obtain an I.D. card in the ID Card Office, 206 Steele Hall. Meal plans are not transferable.

12. To avoid unauthorized use of a SUpocard Food account, lost or stolen I.D. cards must be reported to the ID Card Office as soon as possible. All meal plans and SUpocard Food accounts end on the last day of each session.

13. South Campus Apartments are available on a six-week minimum basis and should be considered if students require their own bedroom. Apartments are shared with other same-gender students.

14. The University does not guarantee specific facilities for summer use. Housing requests will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. Housing assignments (room or apartment) will not be made until summer housing and/or meal plans are paid in full prior to arrival. **Note: single accommodations on North Campus are available on a very limited basis.** If students are assigned to shared accommodations, their bursar accounts will be adjusted accordingly.

15. Students may be reassigned from one room or apartment to another, or occupancy may be terminated after due notice to the student resulting from recommendation by a professional staff member or appropriate judicial body if the student's continued presence is considered detrimental to the residence environment.

16. Students must provide their own linens, blankets, and pillows. Exception: Linen arrangements may be made for select groups or programs for an additional cost. Contact the program coordinator for more information.

17. The nightly housing rate may be charged until proof of housing registration payment is presented to the appropriate housing facility. Such proof must be presented by the close of the next business day after check-in to the housing facility.

18. Smoking is NOT permitted in any of the University's housing facilities.

REFUND POLICY

1. The Office of Housing, Meal Plan, and ID Card Services must be notified of a cancellation or extension of residence. Unless the office is notified otherwise, it is expected that students will occupy a room or apartment under the conditions and during the dates described on the Housing and Meal Plan Application.

2. A student who officially withdraws or leaves a residence facility during the summer session will be charged for the housing and/or meal plan through the end of the week in which he or she leaves.
